- *Validity and Diversity Implications of GRE-Optional Policies in Graduate School Admissions (Job Market Paper)*: Analyzed a large dataset of graduate school applicants using econometric models to quantify the impacts of standardized testing on the long-term success of PhD students and diversity in admitted graduate school cohorts to make policy recommendations
- *Statistical Discrimination*: Formulated a model of economic theory to analyze the impacts of using race and gender information in a general setting of selection under imperfect information, applicable to school admissions, job recruitment or bail decisions. Measured predictive and fairness implications of including demographic variables in algorithmic and human decision-making, employing causal inference and machine learning tools
- *Faculty Meeting vs the Machine*: Developed machine learning algorithms, including lasso and classifiers, that predict admission decisions for applicants with the goal of supporting or supplanting admission committees when selecting candidates for graduate school and addressing questions of efficiency and equity in an analytical manner
- *Women in Politics*: Built a dataset of women elected for state legislatures in United States, conducted a regression discontinuity design analysis on the impact of women taking office on political contributions and engagement of their constituencies
- Presented findings at departmental seminars and other institutions, to audiences of up to 50 participants
